LOWER SCHOOL INDIVIDUALIZED

MATH: Students practice fundamental number sense, fractions, word problems, and algebraic concepts. Lessons include guided instruction with opportunities for independent application and practice.

PHONICS: The Phonics class uses S.P.I.R.E., a research based curriculum, providing multi-sensory reading instruction. The curriculum includes phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. Students are grouped by reading level in order to maximize class time.

READING COMPREHENSION: Through guided small group and whole class literature studies, students increase reading confidence, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. Students will review concepts including identifying main ideas, making predictions, questioning to understand, and making connections.

WRITING: Students create their own magazine and utilize Step-Up to Writing practices to produce articles about topics that interest them. Students learn about Google Drive and continue to develop their typing skills.

JUNIOR HIGH

MATH: Students work on foundational math skills as well as reinforce key concepts at their own level and pace. This class is a great opportunity to fill in gaps and develop new strategies to better understand new material.

WRITING: Students review skills necessary to become proficient writers and receive practice in editing and grammar through fun and interactive warm-up lessons. Students will practice Step-Up to Writing techniques to create outlines that guide them through three well-written descriptive essays.

READING COMPREHENSION: Students read and analyze two novels and cover the concepts of characterization, understanding and summarizing plots, making inferences, cause/effect, and compare/contrast. Writing is required for periodic summaries of the novel.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS: Students enhance communication skills including reading body language and facial expressions, appropriately sharing opinions, understanding the time and place for discussion, and switching from formal to informal conversation.
